The college has a policy for infrastructure maintenance and enhancement, with an Engineering Section overseeing constructions, renovations, and repairs. The college aims to enhance existing infrastructure and add new amenities by providing necessary equipment to labs, such as a gymnasium, swimming pool, and classrooms with LCD projectors. Support staff and caretakers are appointed to maintain these amenities. The college campus has clean and well-maintained environment, with trained support staff checking and repairing equipment regularly. The chemistry lab requires regular purchases of chemicals, glassware, instruments, and LPG gas, and the engineering section manages the maintenance and supply of electricity and water. Hazardous chemicals are disposed to Municipality drainage. The college has three computer labs, one Independent Library, department libraries, computers, and 126 computers. The library is fully automated through an Integrated Library Management System (ILMS) with e-Lib (version 16.2) and library automation software. The college has both indoor and outdoor stadiums, including a gymnasium, swimming pool, and a yoga centre. The playground is used for outdoor games and track events. The college has a well-equipped gymnasium with a builtup area of 1040 sq. meters, this helps the students for active involvement in both outdoor and indoor sports activities.

Solid Waste Management: The use of plastic bags is prohibited inside the campus. The dry solid waste is disposed of by the departments and hostels in the respective dustbins. A collection pit is made available on campus. CMC of Ilkal further collects and disposes. The library produces huge amounts of paper waste, such as old books, magazines and news papers. For a year, they produce almost 25000 pages of newspapers, and this heap of paperis sold to the scrap collectors.

Liquid Waste Management: Waste water from campus and the laboratory is directly connected to the city municipal corporation drainage system through a pipeline. Further, which is sent to the purification unit of the CMC.
